A Secretariat for the ccNSO

A preliminary discussion.....

Secretariat

- The bylaws (deliberately) allow an independent secretariat if we fund it.
- See Art. IX, Section 7; Staff Support and Funding: "Alternatively (to an ICANN staff member) ... Council may designate, at ccNSO expense, another person to serve as ccNSO Staff Manager."
- Different than GNSO staff are "assigned"

Secretariat: What does it do?

- Supports the work of the council
- Similar to Centr's list for the cctld Adcom Secretariat...purely administrative..reports to the Council...maintain the website and mailing lists...
- maintain essential documents
- draft minutes, publish agendas, arrange teleconferences, liaise with "siblings"

What might it Cost?

- Depends: how much does Council want?
- See APTLD eg to follow- US\$ 50k (small)
- See Centr model US\$ 600k, 4 FTE (large)
- Could be roughly comparable with Adcom secretariat, or APTLD secretariat - a Staff Manager (Executive Director), webmaster/technical support, and administrative assistant, or about 1.5 FTE
- Co-hosting with a cctld Regional secretariat will save costs..

Secretariat: What might it Cost?

- BUT! Independence is important, especially if more contentious matters arise, eg in policy development process.
- Not all Regional secretariats are ready.
- Suggest we not co-host with an existing regional secretariat, despite cost savings.
- Cost savings can come from co- hosting at individual registries.
- "rotation" moving from place to place every2 years is how to prevent "capture"

How might we pay for it?

- Members have the power to set ccNSO subscriptions (Section 7, again).
- We can prepare a budget, so we know in advance what likely costs of membership will be.
- * REMEMBER THESE ARE NOT ICANN "DUES!!"
- It should be something like we used to pay for the adcom secretariat - only more certain.

How might we pay for it?

- A set of membership "bands" is fairer than a single "flat" fee.
- If we need, say US\$ 80,000, we could levy say, 40 members \$2000 each.....
- \bullet Or, we could have: 15 paying 0.5k = 7,500
 - 15 paying 1.0k = 15,000
 - 7 paying 5.0k = 35,000
 - 3 paying 7.5k = 22,500
 - TOTAL 80,000

Are those contributions likely?

- We have previously had several countries contributing 10k
- InternetNZ expects to pay 5.0k
- As membership goes up, costs don't (%)
- Some of the costs can still, if we request it, be paid by the board
- Meeting costs, for example, could remain mostly a corporation matter....

What else do we need to do?

- We need to set up a "legal entity", to:
- handle the money
- employ the secretariat
- own and insure the assets laptops,...
- That way, we are independent of the Corporation, for finance and administration.

Why do want independence?

- The ccnso has no legal status it is not an "entity" in its own right.
- Any money "we" bring in, is owned by the Corporation.
- It has to be: billed by the corporation
- accounted for by the corporation
- can be spent by the corporation

Why do want \$\$\$\$ independence?

- Because our experience of the GNSO, and of the Adcom shows us the necessity.
- Getting the Corp'n to issue bills was a nightmare
- Managing "our" money in the whole set of accounts is another.
- Spending money requires board authorisation, or complex "delegations"

Why do want Administrative independence?

- We want our own "quality control"
- We want to ensure our staff report to our Council, not the CEO
- We need to be able to respond quickly if the circumstances require it.
- We need to employ people we trust, according to our job specifications.

Would it be hard to set up?

- No.
- We now have 5 years or more experience among us of international organisation.
- Its not rocket science.
- We have successful models,
- we have a Council to get on with it.

Would it be hard to set up?

- One possible solution already exists....
- A company, called ccNSO Limited is ready
- with 15 Shareholders, one per ccCouncillor
- and 15 directors, who must be Councillors
- registered in the least corrupt, most socially advanced, tax friendly, most beautiful country in the world!
- All details are visible on-line
- Costs of maintenance are minute

Would it be hard to set up?

- Other solutions may be more attractive...
- We just have to start.....
- Lets begin here in KL!
