The comments that ICANN received are summarized below in the relevant question.

Key performance standards and key performance indicators

Timing and accuracy were considered to be reasonable performance standards. In particular, the commenter said the standards should be fully documented and public. The KPIs described in the consultation document were considered sufficient.

Reporting formats

The commenter made several suggestions relating to reporting formats, including the ability to drill down into the data to get specific information and publishing the data in an exportable format. The issue of reporting frequency was also addressed with a proposal for weekly reports to give more frequent data about gTLD requests.

The commenter suggested public reporting of delegation and redelegation requests that take longer than a single reporting cycle so that progress can be tracked. In addition, reports about delegations and redelegations should include data on errors in implementing change requests. This could be published along with reconciliation information when there is a deviation from the 100% accuracy target.

Subscription service

The commenter also suggested a subscription service, which would provide alerts about delegation and redelegation requests and their status.

ICANN accepts the input provided on performance standards.

Reporting formats

As to the issue of publishing reports about ongoing delegation and redelegation requests, ICANN plans to define an acceptable level of detail that will balance the community request for information and the applicants' expectation of confidentiality.
