

ICANN Contractual Compliance Audit Summary (as of August 2018)

This report provides a summary of the number of audits completed to-date and the top five deficiencies noted for each area.

Definitions:

- Initial Audit Population - number of contracted parties (auditees) selected during the audit planning phase based on audit criteria.
- Actual Audit Population - number of auditees in the audit scope. The reduction from initial to actual is due to audit waivers. Audit waivers could range from a request due to changes at an organization or granted to members of a "family" that has been recently audited.
- Family - group of companies that have the same operations and processes in place and that are under common ownership and/or have a parent/subsidiary relationship and organizational structure.
- Audit Criteria - list of factors used for selecting registrars and registries for audit. See <https://www.icann.org/resources/pages/faqs-2012-10-31-en> (Question 3)
- Deficiency - initial finding noted in the audit report that is validated to be noncompliant with the agreement and/or ICANN consensus policy.
- Deficiency rank - deficiency rating by the frequency of its occurrence
