Name of Proposed Service:

Release of Country and Territory Names .hamburg

Technical description of Proposed Service:

V\nPursuant to Section 4 of Specification 5 of the Registry Agreement between ICANN and HAMBURG Top-Level-Domain GmbH (\"Registry Operator\"), we request the release of reserved Country and Territory Names. These include: \text{V\nV\n1}. The short form (in English) of all country and territory names contained on the ISO 3166-1 list, as updated from time to time, including the European Union, which is exceptionally reserved on the ISO 3166-1 list, and its scope extended in August 1999 to any application needed to represent the name European Union. \text{V\n2}. The United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names, Technical Reference Manual for the Standardization of Geographical Names, Part III Names of Countries of the World, and\text{V\n3}. The list of United Nations member states in 6 official United Nations languages prepared by the Working Group on Country Names of the United Nations Conference on the Standardization of Geographical Names.\text{V\n}

Consultation

Please describe with specificity your consultations with the community, experts and or others. What were the quantity, nature and content of the consultations?:

V\nRegistry Operator has not undertaken direct consultation with the community, experts or others. Registry Operator relies on the historical availability of such names in legacy domains, as well as the recent comments of the Governmental Advisory Committee in its October 2014, 2014 Los Angeles Communiqué whereby it recognized that two-character second level domain names are in wide use across existing TLDs, and have not been the cause of any security, stability, technical or competition concerns and indicated no major concerns about registry operators seeking approval for the release of country names and two-letter and character codes at the second level. Registry Operator seeks approval for the release of country and territory names in the .hamburg TLD. Since such names will be used in similar fashion as in existing ccTLDs and gTLDs, it is almost impossible to anticipate any abuse or misconduct, or that such domain name could be confusing to users or otherwise offensive to any country.

\text{VnRegistry Operator relies on its business plans and marketing strategies in concluding that real demand and utility exists for the release of country and territory names to support its activities in the TLD.

V\nRegistry Operator, and also the Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg, support the release of country and territory for use in conjunction with its business purposes in a non-confusing manner. Furthermore, Registry Operator\'s customers and partners who will utilize and identify the .hamburg TLD as the trusted namespace associated with Registry Operator would benefit from and support this proposal. As indicated above, the GAC has not identified concerns or significant issues in the release of such names.

VININ light of the use of the TLD, the lack of objection from the GAC, and, if relevant, the consent of ICANN for the release of country and territory names, there does not appear to be any interested governmental authority, entity, or individual who would object to the release of country and territory names in accordance with this proposal.
